**Stabilizing Families in Crisis**

We help them manage triggers and develop healthy coping skills, so they can transform their lives and move beyond the trauma at the heart of their crisis.

**Strengthening Families and Promoting Permanency**

Family is the foundation of a child's well-being, and every child needs someone to believe in them. Aviva provides the tools and resources to help families raise healthy children. When that can't happen within their own family, Aviva helps the child find stability and permanency with extended family members, foster families, and adoptive parents, giving these children the loving home they need and deserve.

**Empowering Families to Transform Their Lives**

When kids are experiencing problems, prevention and early intervention services are crucial and can change the trajectory of a child's life. Children often act out due to trauma, neglect, abuse, and mental health issues. Aviva steps in at a critical time to help remove the risk from "at-risk," providing holistic therapeutic support, allowing clients to have a "voice and choice" in their treatment, and enabling them to have a positive outcome and to live a happier and healthier life.

Aviva's programs bring families back together, promote permanency, and build stronger and more empowered families. # PROVIDING STABILITY FOR OUR MOST VULNERABLE CHILDREN

Julia\* is a survivor. Placed in three different homes over two years, Julia had a history of self-harm and had been hospitalized for suicidal ideation. At age 14, she began receiving services from Aviva. She participated in a program that serves children with open cases with the Department of Children and Family Services who have had difficulties maintaining a stable foster home placement for an extended period of time.

As Julia connected with her Aviva team and opened up to her therapist, she was able to process powerful thoughts and feelings about her past trauma. Working directly with a rehabilitation specialist, Julia learned how to confront the triggers that led to her self-harm. Over time, she was able to replace destructive behaviors with healthier coping skills.

Empowered by the support system Aviva provides, Julia's academic performance dramatically improved. She began attending classes daily, working with a tutor to complete assigned work, and recovering lost credits from previous absences.

Julia made remarkable progress. There was, however, one more important step for Julia — reunification with her father. Aviva provided support for Julia and her father in preparation for the reunion. Together they anticipated possible challenges and created action plans to assist with possible setbacks. Thanks to this thoughtful planning, Julia's reunification with her father was successful.

Today Julia is on track to graduate high school. By working with Aviva, she is more positively invested in her future, and living an even happier, healthier life than she thought possible.

# STRENGTHENING THE FAMILY

Stacey and John Santos long hoped to become adoptive parents when they joined Aviva as Resource Parents in 2015. While they thought they would adopt an infant, they decided to foster older children. Aviva's Adoption Coordinator utilized the Department of Children and Family Services Matching Coordination Unit, which mostly serves older children within Los Angeles County who are already available for placement with a permanent family. Aviva was able to successfully match Stacey and John with three biological siblings: Darla (9), Johnny (6), and Eddie (5).

Spending time together strengthened the bond between parents and children. Eventually the three siblings moved into the Santos' home.

At first it was a challenge to have three older children in the home. But the family persevered. Supported by Aviva's

Foster Family Agency, the family received therapy and resources that eased the transition to a loving family life. As the siblings adjusted to a new life that offered security and stability, it revealed a perfect fit.

While the children were initially reported to be available for adoption, an unexpected last-minute appeal by the biological mother delayed the adoption. During that time, Stacey and John remained patient. A year later the family signed adoptive placement papers, and the adoption will be finalized by the end of summer 2019.

With the help of Aviva's team of compassionate care providers, the children finally have their forever home, and as they had always hoped, Stacey and John have created a family.

## FAMILY RESOURCE SERVICES (FRS)

FRS places foster youth in safe, trained and loving families through Aviva's licensed Foster Family Agency. Aviva provides training, education, in-home counseling, weekly home visits, and guidance throughout the process.

## COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES (CMHS)

CMHS are community-based, culturally sensitive and trauma-informed mental health services that meet the needs of children and families where they are most comfortable. All family members are included throughout the process as Aviva teams with them towards a positive outcome. Aviva offers an array of counseling and therapeutic services including screening and assessment, individual and family therapy, case management, and psychiatric services.

# EMPOWER

## EMPOWERING OUR YOUNGEST CHILDREN IN CRISIS

Matilda was just two years old when she was referred to Aviva by a Department of Children and Family Services clinician due to child abuse by her biological parents. A witness of domestic violence, Matilda was also profoundly impacted when police and social workers removed her and her sister from their home. Two months later, Matilda and her 3-year-old sister were placed under the care of their maternal grandmother.

At the time of initial assessment, Matilda presented with anxiety, temper tantrums, hyper-vigilance, and fear of adults. To help Matilda recover and to put her on a path to a healthier childhood, she was enrolled in Aviva's **Parent-Child Interaction Therapy** (PCIT). The goals were to help Matilda manage and decrease her anxious feelings, to gain self-confidence, and to build essential trust with her grandmother.

Currently, Matilda shows positive signs of recovery and resilience.

The frequency of her temper tantrums and other symptoms has decreased dramatically. Matilda and her grandmother are successfully completing their PCIT services. Matilda's grandmother also benefited greatly from Aviva services, becoming more empowered in her parenting approach and able to provide a secure and stable home environment where Matilda and her sister live.

As Aviva lifts up Matilda and her sister, they are more empowered children able to relate in healthier ways, to experience a greater sense of security and stability, and to feel connection with their grandmother as they become a stronger family unit.

# WALLIS HOUSE

Putting our programming expertise on the frontlines of homelessness.

Located in Hollywood at Hollywood Boulevard and Camino Palmero, Wallis House is the re-imagining of the Aviva-owned Wallis Annenberg Residence. The historic mansion will offer 42 beds for transitional-aged women who are experiencing homelessness and in need of supportive housing that prepares them for an independent future. With the help of community partners as well as Supervisor Sheila Kuehl, Mayor Eric Garcetti, and Councilmember David Ryu, the residence is undergoing a transformation and will help address the ever-growing homelessness crisis in Los Angeles.

Wallis House will provide a safe home off of the streets for women between the ages of 18 and 24, including mothers and their young children, who are experiencing or are at risk of homelessness. Wallis House will change the lives of these young women by providing a safe home where they will receive the therapeutic support and skill-building opportunities needed to transition to a self-sufficient life off of the streets. The programming at Wallis House is designed to empower and strengthen these young adults, while offering them a path to resilience.

Opening at the end of 2019, the residence will offer therapeutic services, training, job readiness skills, and community mental health services for women in need. It promises to be a place that lifts up vulnerable young women, while helping provide much needed temporary housing during Los Angeles' homeless crisis.

# HONORING THE ANDELSON FAMILY

## Three Generations of Lifting Us Up

It was September 1990 when Miriam and Sherman Andelson first began serving on Aviva's Board of Directors.

"My parents had a legacy of involvement with charitable organizations for much of their adult life and encouraged me and my sister to do the same," Bruce Andelson said.

"In high school and college, while other kids worked at summer jobs, we were encouraged to work for community organizations," Bruce recounts. For a few summers Bruce and his sister worked with Head Start as counselors. The elder Andelsons arranged for food deliveries for Head Start, both by paying for it and getting Sherman's clients to contribute. The result was some very well-fed Head Start centers!

About ten years ago Sherman Andelson had been on the board for more than twenty years and it was time to pass on the legacy and step down. He asked son Bruce to join the Aviva Board. Bruce recalls, "I had been to Aviva events for a number of years, thought it was a very worthwhile charity and, at the invitation of the Board, joined Aviva."

Bruce served as Chair (2012-2016) and is now the head of the Finance Committee, just as his father had been.

Now daughter Sari Kern has picked up the mantle and begun to support Aviva by chairing the new Associate Board of Directors.

"I have been going to the galas for as long as I can remember. Hearing the kinds of conditions that people have overcome with the help of Aviva helped me maintain hope for humanity — especially as an ER nurse," Sari said.

She has seen many of the negative impacts of homelessness as a nurse. People arrive in the ER drug-addicted, in pain, and suffering. She reflects on how these people could never seem to find the hope or the mercy they needed.

"Most of the time, if a patient experiencing homelessness stopped coming in, it was because he or she died," Sari said. "The system is so broken and needs so much work, and watching what Aviva has done for people has always stuck with me."

As the Andelson family lifts up others, Sari yearns for a day when there's enough help, resources, and mercy to lift up anyone and everyone who is ready for a better life.

Aviva is so grateful to the Andelson family — three generations of exceptional generosity and a shared sense of our mission to lift up our most vulnerable children and families.

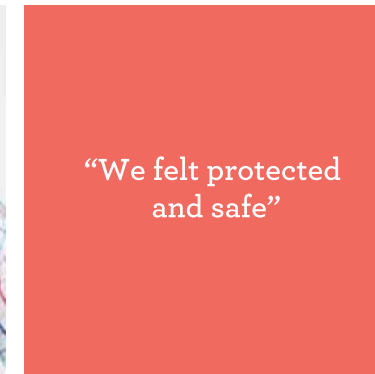

RESULTS FROM AVIVA'S BIYEARLY SATISFACTION ASSESSMENT, FALL 2018



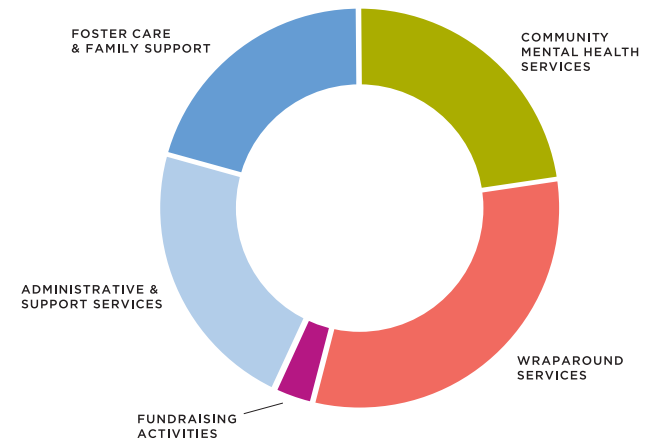
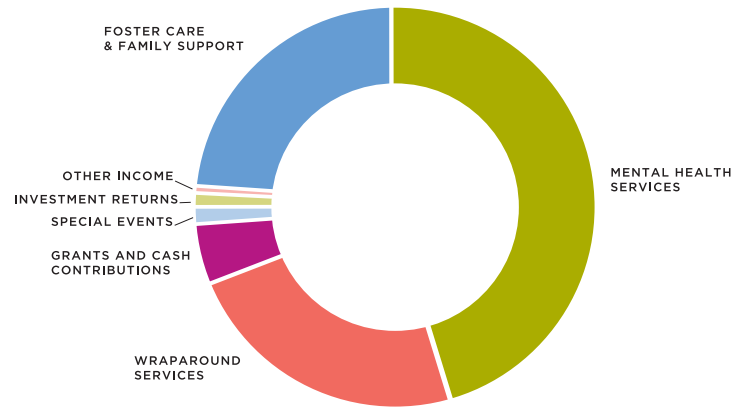

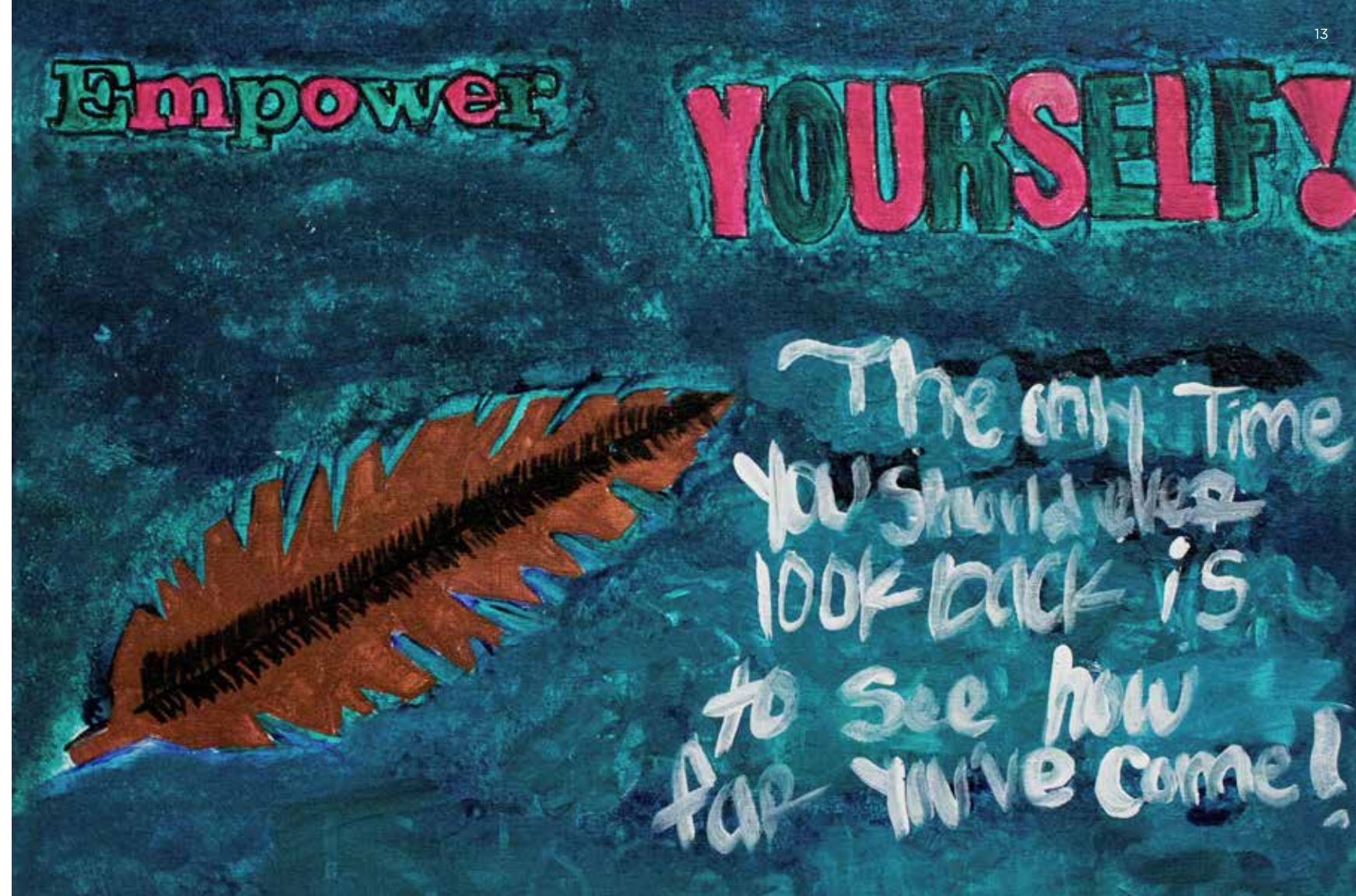
